Appeals & Referrals

Appeal

The Appeals Body of Mr Michael Hickey (Chairman), Mr Noel McCaffrey and Mr Jack Rearden convened at the Offices of the Irish Horseracing Regulatory Board on Tuesday, 23 September to consider the appeal of Jamie Powell (Rider) against the decision of the Raceday Stewards at Leopardstown on 13 September 2025.

On the day, following the Irish Stallion Farms EBF Petingo Handicap, the Raceday Stewards found Mr Powell, rider of Lord Church in breach of Rule 214, in that he had ridden carelessly. Having considered Mr Powell's record in this regard (second offence), the Raceday Stewards suspended him for four racedays.

The grounds of appeal lodged by Mr Powell was that he felt he did not cause interference and maintained his racing line at all times around the first bend.

At the appeal hearing, evidence was heard from Mr Powell. The Appeals Body also watched a recording of the race,

In his evidence, Mr Powell stated that on the approach to the first bend, all riders were close together and it was becoming tight, however he did not receive any pressure from his outside as they turned the bend. Mr Powell explained that he maintained his line and did not contribute to any movement on his inside and described how Rory Cleary, rider of Buddy One was the only rider to give a shout prior to the incident.

Having considered the evidence, the Appeals Body allowed the appeal as they could not apportion blame to Mr Powell for the incident.

The appeal was presented by Andrew Coonan, Coonan Cawley Solicitors on behalf of Mr Powell. The IHRB was represented by Ms Christine Traynor BL, IHRB Head of Racing Regulation and Integrity and Mr Andrew Ring, IHRB Stipendiary Steward.

Appeal

The Appeals Body Mr N B Wachman, (Chairman), Mr Anthony Byrne, and Mr Martin P O'Donnell convened at the Offices of the Irish Horseracing Regulatory Board on Tuesday, 9 September to consider the appeal of Declan McDonogh (Rider) against the decision of the Raceday Stewards at Tipperary on 31 August 2025

On the day, following the running of the Coolmore No Nay Never Fairy Bridge Stakes, the Raceday Stewards found Mr McDonogh, rider of Mataariki (FR) in breach of Rule 214, in that he had ridden carelessly and having considered his record in this regard (second offence), the Raceday Stewards suspended him for seven racedays.

The grounds of appeal lodged by Mr McDonogh was against the severity of the suspension. At the appeal hearing, evidence was heard from Mr McDonogh. The Appeals Body also watched a recording of the race.

In his evidence, Mr McDonogh explained that due to deteriorating ground conditions he wanted to come up the stand side of the track in the straight and he expressed this to Jack Kearney, rider of Chantez, on his outside on two occasions. Mr McDonogh accepted that the move took the Riders behind him by surprise, but he added that it is common that horses come up the stand side in Tipperary as the ground gets softer. Mr McDonogh accepted that it was careless on his behalf but that he is very conscious of safety and his previous exemplary record proves that point with only one previous offence in approximately 2,400 rides over the last six years in a number of different iurisdictions.

Having reviewed the race footage and having considered the evidence and submissions made by Mr McDonogh, the Appeals Body upheld the decision of the Raceday Stewards to find Mr McDonogh in breach of Rule 214 and suspended him for seven racedays.

The appeal was presented by Mr McDonogh. The IHRB was represented by Ms Christine Traynor BL, IHRB Head of Racing Regulation and Integrity and Mr Leighton Aspell, IHRB Stipendiary Steward.

Referral

The Referrals Committee, Mr Peter M Allen (Chairman), Mr Raymond McSharry and Dr Paddy Molony convened in the offices of the Irish Horseracing Regulatory Board on Tuesday, 16 September 2025 to consider whether Mrs Cathy O'Leary (Trainer) was in breach of the rules of racing as a result of a report received from LGC Laboratories, Fordham, UK.

The report received on 30 October 2024, confirmed that the urine sample taken from Nibiru following the Injuredjockeys.com Apprentice Claiming Race at Dundalk on 18 October 2024 was confirmed by LGC Laboratories to contain beta/dexamethasone.

The option of 'B' sample analysis was requested by Mrs O'Leary and the presence of dexamethasone was confirmed by LCH Laboratories, France, on 12 December 2024.

Evidence was heard from Dr Graham Adams, IHRB Deputy Head of Veterinary Operations, Mrs O'Leary and Mr Donncha Houlihan, Veterinary Surgeon.

In his evidence, Dr Adams gave details of the IHRB investigation. He outlined that dexamethasone is a corticosteroid with anti-inflammatory and analgesic properties used to treat a variety of conditions in horses, including lameness and respiratory disease. Dr Adams explained that when administered by intravenous injection it is clear liquid at a single dose of 15ml for a 500kg horse, and that the published detection time is five days (the European Horserace Scientific Liaison Committee). Dr Adams explained that the investigation revealed that Nibiru was treated

with the anti-inflammatory (dexamethasone) two days prior to the race. Dr Adams explained that the detection of dexamethasone in a sample would confirm that the medication is still having an effect on a horse. Dr Adams also added that following a stable inspection on 4 November 2024, the IHRB veterinary team noted that as well as evidence of a lay person giving intravenous injections to multiple horses over multiple months, that there was a failure to keep the Medicines Register up to date as some medications were not recorded at the time, as required under the Rules.

In her evidence, Mrs O'Leary outlined how she sought advice from her Veterinary Surgeon, Mr Houlihan, to help Nibiru get through the race as he appeared to be off form. Mrs O'Leary stated that she was working off the advice of Mr Houlihan who advised a two day withdrawal period for dexamethasone. Mrs O'Leary accepted that it was unacceptable for the Medicines Register to be out of date and a deficiency in record keeping is a serious issue.

In his evidence, Mr Houlihan confirmed that he examined Nibiru on multiple occasions over the previous three years. Two days prior to the race he found the horse to be sore on his right hind and sore when flexing the fetlock. Mr Houlihan stated that he administered dexamethasone intravenously and advised the Trainer that 48 hours was sufficient withdrawal time due to the low levels he administered. On cross examination Dr Houlihan accepted that he gave the medication and his advice on the timeframe was outside of the recommended period as published.

Having considered the evidence the Referrals Committee were satisfied that Mrs O'Leary was in breach of Rule 96(i) in that there was a prohibited substance in the Horse on Raceday, and they disqualified Nibiru from the race, ordered the placings be altered accordingly and the stake forfeited. The Referrals Committee imposed a fine of €1,000 on Mrs O'Leary in respect of the breach of Rule 96(i). Furthermore, the Referrals Committee found Mrs O'Leary in breach of Rule 148(i), in that the Trainer is responsible for everything connected with the welfare, training and running of all Horses under their care. The Referrals Committee imposed a fine of €1,000 in respect of the breach of Rule 148(i). Mrs O'Leary was found in breach of Rule 148(iii), in that the Trainer is responsible for ensuring that all members of staff and any other person with access to medicines is fully conversant with the Rules and Regulations relating to Prohibited Substances, and a fine of €300 was imposed in respect of this breach. The Referrals Committee also found Mrs O'Leary in breach of Rule 148(iv), in that the Medicines Register was incomplete and for this breach imposed a fine of €500.

Referral

The Referrals Committee, Mr Martin P O'Donnell (Chairman), Mr Raymond J McSharry and Mr Jack Rearden convened at the offices of the Irish Horseracing Regulatory Board on Tuesday, 1 July and Thursday, 11 September 2025 to consider the referral of Jessica Harrington (Trainer) and Simon Torrens (Rider) following the Spring Two Day National Hunt Meeting Maiden Hurdle at Kilbeggan on Friday, 25 April 2025.

On the day, the Raceday Stewards enquired into the running and riding of Powerful, trained by Mrs Harrington and ridden by Mr Torrens, placed second, and requested an examination by the IHRB Veterinary Officer. The Veterinary Officer reported a small wound on the outside of Powerful's right fore and noted a righthand side cardiac murmur.

Following receipt of a Veterinary Report on 12 May 2025 which confirmed the cardiac murmur as physiologically normal, the matter was referred to the Referrals Committee for consideration by an IHRB Senior Racing Official.

The Referrals Committee convened on 1 July 2025 and following a submission from Mr David Geoghegan BL on behalf of Mrs Harrington regarding jurisdiction and the reliance on a subsection of Rule 27 cited in the notice issued to the Respondent, the matter was adjourned to allow all parties to provide written submissions. Following a review of the written submissions, the Referrals Committee were satisfied that the hearing could proceed, and the Referrals Committee reconvened on 11 September 2025.

At the hearing, evidence was heard from Mrs Harrington, Mr Torrens, Dr Graham Adams, IHRB Deputy Head of Veterinary Operations and Dr Pia Kirsten Randleff-Rasmussen, Veterinary Surgeon. The Referrals Committee also watched a recording of the race.

In his evidence, Dr Adams explained that the IHRB issued a request to Mrs Harrington for a further cardiac evaluation of Powerful as part of the IHRB's Suitability To Race program. The veterinary certificate noted a murmur post exercise that was evaluated as a normal physiologic event and would not preclude this horse from future racing. Dr Adams stated that from the Veterinary Officer report on the day of the race and the veterinary certificate supplied by Mrs Harrington that in his opinion the horse on the day of the race was not affected by the post-race murmur.

In her evidence, Dr Randleff-Rasmussen stated that she performed an examination on the horse on 7 May and found him to be clinically normal. A murmur was identified post exercise on the right-hand side which was a result of turbulent blood flow. In her opinion Dr Randleff-Rasmussen stated this was not unusual for a large horse with a large heart and would not increase danger to himself or a rider during training and racing and that it would not impact performance.

In his evidence, Mr Torrens outlined that he spoke to Mrs Harrington on his way to the racecourse and received instructions to jump off, get his mount settled, get him to jump and do his best from there; in his opinion this is what happened. Mr Torrens explained that Kilbeggan is a unique track in that there is

essentially no straight, and he was brought off his racing line and forced further left on the run in by Park That, ridden by Jody McGarvey, who was on his inside. Mr Torrens stated that he felt Park That was running markedly left and was intimidating his horse. Mr Torrens explained to the Referrals Committee that he had made every effort on his horse and had ridden out to the line at his strongest.

In her evidence, Mrs Harrington stated that her instructions to Mr Torrens were to try and get his mount to settle, get him jumping and to try and get him into a good rhythm as he's a big horse and can be awkward at times. Mrs Harrington added that she advised Mr Torrens to keep it simple. Mrs Harrington confirmed she was happy with the ride given to Powerful by Mr Torrens and confirmed that she felt the horse was a young horse who was still maturing and strengthening up.

Having considered the evidence, the Referrals Committee were satisfied that no further action was warranted.

The case was presented by Ms Christine Traynor BL, IHRB Head of Racing Regulation and Integrity and Mr Andrew Ring, IHRB Stipendiary Steward. Mrs Jessica Harrington was represented by Mr David Geoghegan BL instructed by Mr Kevin Power, Maurice Power Solicitors. Mr Simon Torrens was represented by Andrew Coonan, Solicitor, of Coonan Cawley Solicitors.

Referral

The Referrals Committee, Mr Justice Tony Hunt convened on Friday, 29 August 2025 at the offices of the Irish Horseracing Regulatory Board to consider the referral of Ben Harvey (Rider), Alex Harvey (Rider) and Tom Harney (Rider) following the running of the O'Driscolls Irish Whiskey Handicap at Leopardstown on Wednesday, 9 April 2025.

On the day, the IHRB became aware of a television interview on RacingTV in which it was suggested that Ben Harvey, Alex Harvey and Tom Harney were amongst a wider syndicate of owners of the winner, Harbanaker, which as professional jockeys would constitute a breach of Rule 124. Furthermore, the owner of Harbanaker is published as Ms Niamh Harvey and not a partnership or syndicate of owners as suggested in the television interview.

As part of an investigation into the circumstances surrounding the ownership of Harbanaker, submissions were received from Mrs Niamh Harvey, Mr Tom Harney, Mr Alex Harvey, Mr Ben Harvey, Mr Charlie Mullins, Mr Finian Maguire, Mr Harry Swan and Mr John Gleeson.

At the referral hearing, submissions were heard from Mr Andrew Coonan, solicitor, on behalf of Ben Harvey, Alex Harvey and Tom Harney.

Mr Coonan outlined the background to a group of friends uniting in their grief following the untimely passing of Michael O'Sullivan and using this horse as an outlet to come together. Mr Coonan accepted that their actions which led to a perception that they were part owners of the horse were not appropriate as licensees but insisted that Niamh Harvey is the sole owner of the horse in question.

Having considered the evidence and submissions put forward, Justice Hunt delivered his written decision, as set out below, on Monday 8 September 2025.

"This referrals in this matter originated in a televised interview broadcast on Racing TV from Leopardstown Racecourse on 9 April 2025, after Race 8 (the O'Driscolls Irish Whiskey Handicap). In essence, footage and statements arising from the interview in question suggested that the three licensed professional Riders listed above may have held or claimed an interest in the winner of this race (Harbanaker, owned by Niamh Harvey and trained by William Harvey). If these statements were true, these riders would have been in breach of Rule 124 of the Rules of Racing, which clearly prohibits such a situation.

Subsequent investigation by and correspondence with the IHRB established that the Riders did not have the interest claimed by them in the interview, and that there was therefore no breach of the prohibition on professional jockeys owning or having an interest in a horse running in the race.

In the course of that correspondence, the three Riders accepted that "such inaccurate claims cause or potentially cause a significant problem for the IHRB and have raised a legitimate concern. For this, they are deeply apologetic. It was never the intention that the interview or holding themselves out (incorrectly) as a horse owing syndicate would create a significant issue for the IHRB."

Thereafter, the IHRB referred to the Committee the matter of whether the conduct and statements of the Riders in the course of the interview constituted a breach of Rule 272, which prohibits any person involved in horseracing acting, whether verbally or by conduct or behaviour, in a manner prejudicial to the integrity, proper conduct, or good reputation of horseracing.

Submissions

The referral was heard by the Committee (sole member Mr Justice Tony Hunt) on 29 August 2025, on the basis of the IHRB investigation, the correspondence arising in the course of that investigation and the agreed facts that thereby emerged.

Andrew Coonan (solicitor on behalf of the three Riders) submitted that the three Riders should not be found in breach in breach of Rule 272, because the facts did not pass a minimum threshold of gravity, and/or the conduct in question was not intentional or premeditated, and that a breach of this Rule required a deliberate attempt or contrivance.

In response, Christine Traynor (on behalf of the IHRB) referred to the correspondence that had previously passed between the parties, and submitted that the conduct in question did not have to be intentional or premeditated to attract the operation of the Rule, and that the conduct in question was of sufficient concern and gravity to cause a breach of Rule 272, warranting the imposition of a fine above the entry level (€250) referred to in the relevant guideline. Ms Traynor suggested that the appropriate range in these cases was between €500 and €1000.

In reply, Mr Coonan suggested that the fine ought to be lower than the entry level, or that the matter be disposed of by a method other than the imposition of a fine.

Decision

The conduct of the riders in wrongly stating in public either expressly or by obvious implication that they had an ownership interest in the winning horse is sufficiently serious to justify a

finding of breach of Rule 272(i). Rule 124 of the Rules contains a clear prohibition of the ownership arrangement situation asserted by or on behalf of the three riders, to the effect that they were part of a group who had "thrown a few quid" into the horse after it came up for sale.

The statements of fact expressing or implying a breach of this Rule by them were made in the context of a post-race interview on the Racing TV channel, the audience of which includes many of those who are most interested in and knowledgeable about Irish racing matters. The IHRB would have been remiss if it was not concerned by media statements suggesting breach of a significant general prohibition on professional riders being involved in horse ownership in any circumstances.

The Riders themselves have rightly accepted the legitimacy of the concerns caused by their incorrect statements. Therefore, the making of incorrect statements by licensees suggesting that they were in breach of the Rules of Racing on a significant media platform is, in principle, clearly sufficient to constitute a breach of Rule 272(i) by each of the three Riders, resulting in the imposition of a sanction specified by the Rules

It is not necessary that a breach of Rule 272(i) be founded on deliberate or intentional conduct, or that there be premeditation. Many recent cases show that the Rule may be breached carelessly, negligently, or by inadvertence.

The words or conduct in this case were plainly prejudicial to the integrity and proper conduct of horse racing, and each of the riders were in breach of Rule 272(i).

The sanction imposed in respect of the breaches must be proportionate to the gravity of the misconduct and reflect any relevant personal or other circumstances. All licensees have a duty to take reasonable care in making statements of fact to media outlets regarding their horse racing activities. This is especially so where, as in this case, to take the statement of fact at face value would suggest to the informed listener that the licensees were engaging in conduct otherwise prohibited by the Rules of Racing.

On the other hand, it is accepted by all parties that the statements were inaccurate and made against the particularly tragic and emotional background referred to in the interview. Ultimately, there was significant co-operation with the investigation, as seen in the correspondence quoted above.

Having regard to the weight of this unusual mitigation, a fine at the lower end of the scale is warranted in each case. In other circumstances, a significantly more severe sanction would be justified by such careless public statements, the investigation of which necessarily but needlessly consumed the time and resources of the IHRB.

It is not considered that the breaches or the circumstances otherwise justify a disposal outside the formal sanctions or guidelines available to the Referrals Committee. Each rider is therefore fined the sum of €400."

Acceptance of entries is subject to the power to refuse to allow entries to be accepted conferred by the Orders and Rules of Racing on the British Horseracing Authority Ltd. Entries are accepted by the Racing Calendar Office, acting as aforesaid, causing the name of the horse in question to be published as being entered for the race in question either in The Racing Calendar, when the race closes more than six days before running, or, for other races, on the British Horseracing Authority Racing Administration Internet site (www.racingadmin.co.uk) and ordinarily in the Sporting Press.

FRANCE - Owners and trainers of horses trained outside of France are reminded that, to enter any horse in a French race for the first time, they must register their horses in training through their access online at least 8 days before the closing time of entry, with the correct name of the horse, its suffix, sex, year of foaling and pedigree (sire, dam and sire of dam).

This declaration is not considered as an entry. Trainers are to make their entries and other declarations directly online. Evidence was heard from the rider who accepted he had manoeuvred to the rail before the marker poles. Having viewed the recording of the race and considered evidence, the Raceday Stewards were satisfied the rider was in breach of Rule 211. Having considered his clean record, they suspended him for one raceday.

The Raceday Stewards enquired into an incident in the straight involving Magny Cours, ridden by Ben Coen, placed fifth, and Smexy, ridden by James Ryan, placed sixth, where it appeared contact was made between the two horses. Evidence was heard from the riders concerned. B.M. Coen said his mount leaned left for a stride but he corrected her immediately. J.J.G. Ryan said he received slight pressure from his right. Having viewed the recording of the race and considered the evidence, the Raceday Stewards took no further action.

The IHRB Veterinary Officer examined Kensington Lane, trained by Donnacha Aidan O'Brien, at the request of the Raceday Stewards and reported the animal to be post-race normal.

Coen said he went for a gap but it closed as he was getting into it. S.T. McCullagh said he mount received pressure from his right when Chally Chute made contact with his mount's hind quarters. J.A. Heffernan said he kept his line. Having viewed the recording of the race and considered the evidence, the Raceday Stewards took no further action.

Sam Coen, rider of Chally Chute, trained by Ross O'Sullivan, reported to the Stewards' Secretaries that he took a precautionary check after a couple of furlongs when it became tight in front of him.

The Raceday Stewards enquired into an incident at around the four furlong marker involving Aeronautic, ridden by M.W. Hassett, and Falcon Eight, ridden by C.D. Hayes, where it appeared interference may have occurred. Evidence was heard from the riders concerned. M.W. Hassett said he edged out but was not aware of Falcon Eight on his outer. C.D. Hayes said he had to check when Aeronautic moved left. Having viewed the recording of the race and considered the evidence, the Raceday Stewards took no further action other than to remind M.W. Hassett to be more aware of the horses around him in future.

C.D. Hayes, rider of Falcon Eight, trained by D.K. Weld, reported to the Clerk of the Scales that his mount was struck into turning in.

The IHRB Veterinary Officer examined Nurburgring, trained by Joseph Patrick O'Brien, at the request of the Raceday Stewards and reported the animal to be post-race normal.

289H Download The Tote App (Q.R.) H'cap The Raceday Stewards enquired into an incident in the straight involving Brewel Hill, ridden by Mr R.W. Barron, unplaced, and Tilani, ridden by Mr P.J. Smullen, placed sixth, where it appeared Tilani was tight on the rail. Evidence was heard from the riders concerned. Mr Barron said he was keeping his line on the rail when a horse came on his inside where there was not room. Mr Smullen said he went for a gap which tightened as he was getting into it. Having viewed the recording of the race and considered the evidence, the Raceday Stewards found Mr P.J. Smullen was in breach

of Rule 214 in that he had ridden carelessly. Having considered his clean record in this regard, the Raceday Stewards suspended him for three racedays. In arriving at their decision, the Racedays Stewards took into account both the severity of the incident and the rider's inexperience.

As the rider was being attended to by medical staff, the Raceday Stewards referred the incident onto a Senior Racing Official for further investigation under the provisions of Rule 14(ii)(b).

The Raceday Stewards enquired into an incident in the straight involving Hemight, ridden by Mr P.W. Gleeson, unplaced, Vivacious Lady, ridden by Miss M. O'Sullivan, unplaced, and Gotta Catch'em All, ridden by Miss M. Walsh, where it appeared Gotta Catch'em All was manoeuvered right causing interference to Hemight and Vivacious Lady. Evidence was heard from the riders concerned. Mr Gleeson said he was keeping straight but had to check. Miss O'Sullivan said at the time she did not feel much interference but accepted she was carried off her line. Miss Walsh said it was tight in front of her so she had to go left to get a run. Having viewed the recording of the race and considered the evidence, the Raceday Stewards found Miss M. Walsh was in breach of Rule 214 in that she had ridden carelessly. Having considered her clean record in this regard, the Raceday Stewards suspended her for two racedays.

Mr H.C. Swan, rider of Victoria Kesia, trained by Joseph G. Murphy, reported to the Clerk of the Scales that his saddle slipped causing his horse to buck and unseat him.
