



Dear Trainer,

As you are aware, Rule 91 which concerns the time intervals for Equine Influenza vaccination came into effect in Ireland and Great Britain on 1st January 2022. This change was necessary to ensure maximum protection for our racing population against this infectious disease both for individual and herd health – as with other viruses, immunity only lasts for a relatively short period after vaccination and so more frequent boosters are needed.

The new time intervals are as follows:

	CURRENT INTERVAL	INTERVAL FROM 1 JANUARY 2022
V1 - V2	21 – 92 days	21 – 60 days
V2 - V3	150 – 215 days	120 – 180 days
BOOSTER	Not more than 1 year apart	Not more than six months apart

This Rule change effectively splits horses into two different categories in 2022:

1. Horses which have had their first vaccination on or before 31/12/21

horses which have had at least a V1 (and don't have to restart for any reason) on or before 31/12/21 can remain on the old intervals but as of 01/01/23 must have had a vaccination within the previous six months to be qualified to run

2. Horses which haven't had a V1 before 01/01/2022

horses which haven't had a V1 before 01/01/22 and any previous course of vaccinations have expired, must be vaccinated according to the Interval from 1 January 2022 noted above

In point 2 above, if the horse is not correctly vaccinated according to the new intervals then it will not be qualified to run in 2022 until it is correctly vaccinated in accordance with the new intervals.

Example 1: Two horses are entered to run in a race on the 15th April 2022, each horse has two flu vaccinations certified on their passports and uploaded to the Weatherbys ePassport App:

Horse A:

V1 31/12/21

V2 31/03/22 - Interval between V1 and V2 is 90 days, horse qualified to run as V1 before 01/01/22 and old intervals (21 to 92 days) still apply

Horse B:

V1 01/01/22

V2 31/03/22 - Interval between V1 and V2 is 89 days, interval is less than Horse A above, but this horse is not qualified to run as V1 is in 2022 and interval between V1 and V2 does not conform to new interval of 21-60 days.





Example 2: Two horses are entered to run in a race on 15th November 2022, each horse has three flu vaccinations certified on their passports and uploaded to the Weatherbys ePassport App:

Horse A:

- V1 31/12/21
- V2 31/03/22
- V3 31/10/22 - *Interval between V2 and V3 is 214 days, horse qualified to run as V1 before 01/01/22 and old intervals (150 to 215 days) still apply*

Horse B:

- V1 01/01/22
- V2 01/03/22
- V3 01/09/22 – *Interval between V2 and V3 is 184 days, horse not qualified to run as V1 is on 01/01/2022 and the interval between V2 and V3 does not conform to the new interval of 120 – 180 days*

Example 3: A horse which has had three vaccinations in 2022 certified on its passport and uploaded to the Weatherbys ePassport App is entered to run in a race on 15th December 2022

- V1 01/01/22
- V2 01/02/22
- V3 01/06/22 – *Horse not qualified to run as V1 is on 01/01/2022 and Interval between V3 and raceday (15th December) is greater than six months*

Please note that Booster vaccinations should be administered no more than six months apart, according to calendar months rather than a fixed number of days. For example, a horse that is fully vaccinated on 1st March 2022 would require a booster on or before 1st September 2022. Examples of potential month end scenarios for consideration are included in the table below





V3 or booster administered on	To consider when calculating 6 monthly (or less) intervals	Booster to be administered on or before
December 31 st	No June 31 st	June 30 th
January 31 st		July 31 st
February 28 th		August 28 th
February 29 th	Leap Year	August 29 th
March 31 st	No September 31 st	September 30 th
April 30 th		October 30 th
May 31 st	No November 31 st	November 30 th
June 30 th		December 30 th
July 31 st		January 31 st
August 28 th		February 28 th
August 29 th -31 st	Non-Leap Year, no Feb 29 th - 31 st	February 28 th
